The couple honeymooned in Bermuda. They make their home in Center City Philadelphia.

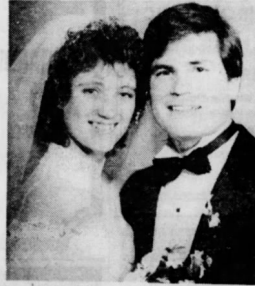
Butcher-Quay
